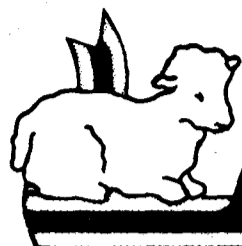
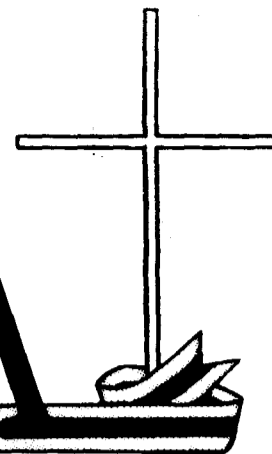

Twenty-five thousand college students across the nation will gather Dec. 27, 1983 to Jan. 1, 1984 in Kansas City, Missouri for KC 83. Sponsored by Campus Crusade for Christ, this conference is open to all Christians who desire to see God's power unleashed on every campus, effectively reaching students.

As Josh McDowell, one of the speakers at KC 83, said, "A conviction is developing among Christian college students today. It's a conviction that says, 'Hey, if other people can assert

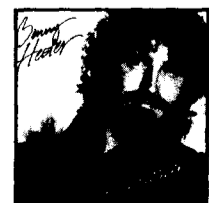

The Navigators

Following the principle of spiritual reproduction, Navigator staff and trained laborers begin their ministries on a one-to-one basis and in small groups. They win people to Christ and then personally follow them up, teaching them the fundamentals of effective Christian living.

Navigators stress the importance of every believer being equipped to do the work of ministry rather than a select group of professionals. Each new believer is personally exhorted to discipline himself in Bible study, scripture memory, prayer and personal evangelism in order that he may grow spiritually, then pass on to others those things he has learned.

The ministry is interdenominational, and its work on campus is led by student team leaders under the guidance of full-time staff personnel. Both mistakes are ill-fated, because they make non-Christians run for cover.

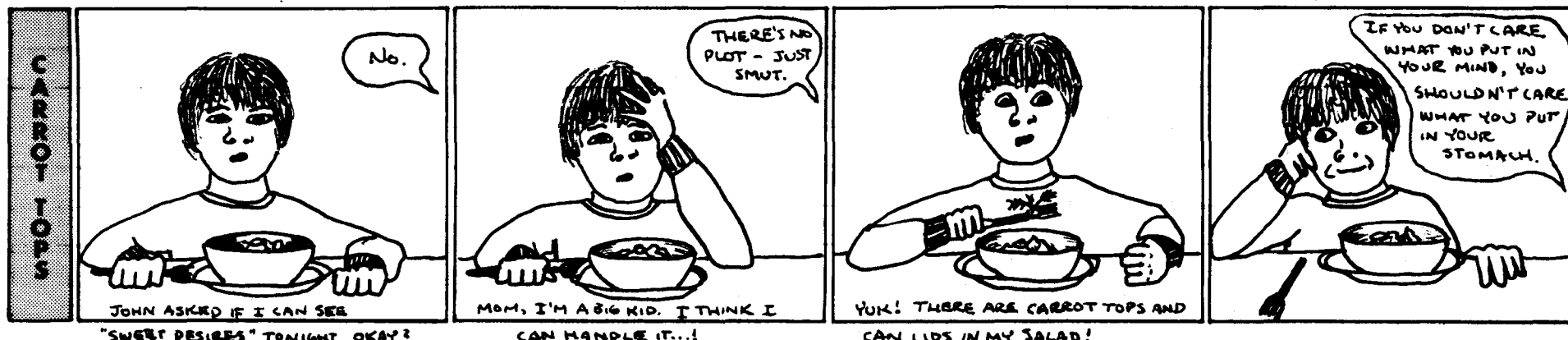
